### WHAT IS MAYFACS HARDSHIP FUND

You may be finding it difficult to make ends meet at the moment, or going through a change in living or family situation. You may, for example, need to purchase an essential piece of equipment to support you at home, but do not have the funds available. Or perhaps you cannot afford to cover the additional costs of your child's education and learning such as school trips or equipment.







There are many reasons you may be finding things a little bit harder at the moment, and MAYFACS can support you during this time. Our Hardship Fund is a restricted fund, provided by very generous donations and grants, to support people who live, work or attend school in the Mayfield and Five Ashes Parish.

### OTHER SUPPORT AVAILABLE FROM MAYFACS

FOODBANK REFERRALS: We are able to make referrals for families and individuals to local foodbanks for anyone in need of this support, be it short term or longer. Parcels are created for you, and specific requests/dietary requirements can also be accommodated. Collections or deliveries to your house are both available. Anyone who wishes to donate food to the local foodbanks can do so at their local supermarkets and help support others in need.





COMMUNITY FRIDGES/LARDERS: These are available at Heathfield, Hailsham and Uckfield and are open to anyone, no questions asked, to collect food as and when you need it. They are there to prevent food waste and support our environment by ensuring food goes to a home. They receive donations from supermarkets, cafes, local produce suppliers, and other generous donors, as well as the general public. Food generally includes fruit and vegetables, bread, cakes and pastries, and cold items.

Support Volunteers: With our incredible team of volunteers, we can support you should you need help with emergency shopping, getting to our activities, navigating other support services and agencies, as well as borrowing a wheelchair, DVD or Jigsaw!

If you need us for anything, please just get in touch, and if we can't help, we can tell you who can! We are here for everyone within our community.

Consultation 27 November 2023 - 25 February 2024

We want you to have your say on the future of transport in the County?

The draft East Sussex Local Transport Plan 2024 - 2050, sets out how we will plan and provide transport for people taking every day journeys in East Sussex, which include getting to school, work or for leisure, now and in the future.

The plan recognises factors that are important for journeys to school such as enabling safer and more accessible journeys, the benefits to health and wellbeing from more active travel, even if this is part for part of your journey or being undertaken on certain days of the week.

Many of you will often be combining the school run with other journeys, so undertaking multiple trips, to get to work or for other purposes, so the plan recognises the importance of having a connected transport network.
